

GENERAL SHOW RULES

GENERAL INFORMATION:

All entry blanks must be completely and accurately filled out on TPEA entry forms before a horse is allowed to enter the arena for a class. Add or scratch sheets must also be filled out. The TPEA Show secretary will not be held responsible for submitting incomplete show results to PHBA. Pre-entries should be e-mailed or mailed by the deadline to receive the pre-entry fees. **Owners & exhibitors must be members of TPEA to show.** A signed check, credit card on file or cash payment will be made before entering the first class, no exceptions. A copy of the PHBA registration, current Coggins, membership (owner & exhibitor), youth & amateur cards must be presented for inspection by show management. A copy of a performance ROM must be on file in order to show in Performance halter.

The Show Management reserves the right combine or split classes and to accept and refuse entries cordially.

Classes without 3 entries will be combined or canceled except in Halter and in the Palomino Open Division if there is a conflict with someone showing a Junior & Senior horse.

SPONSORSHIP OF CLASSES:

Sponsorships with a value of \$500 or more will be reviewed by the State Board of Directors. The State Board of Directors has the authority to approve the conditions of the donation and set a time deadline that the funds must be received by TPEA.

INDIVIDUAL SHOW AWARDS

Ribbons are given from first through sixth place. Grand & Reserve rosettes for halter.

All-Around High Points and Reserve High Points are given at each show. (total points for the weekend)

1. All classes in each division will count. (except walk-trot Jackpot, Parade & speed)
2. Ties will be broken as follows:
 - A. The horse that won the most first places.
 - B. The horse that won the most second places, third places & so on.
 - C. The horse entered in the most classes.

TPEA Open Division (Open Senior Horse, Open Junior Horse): Must show in Halter &/or Color, plus 2 performance classes (excluding Walk-trot jackpot, parade & speed).

TPEA Amateur & Youth Division (Amateur, Amateur Select, Amateur Walk-trot, Youth 5-9 Walk-trot , Youth 10-18 Walk-Trot, Youth 13 & Under & Youth 14-18): Must show in Halter, Color &/or Showmanship plus 2 performance classes (excluding parade & speed)

All Breed Division (18 & Under and 19 & Over): Must show in Halter, Color &/or Showmanship plus 2 performance classes (excluding parade & speed)

Challenge Rider Division (Advanced and Walk/Trot): No class requirement

ELIGIBILITY FOR YEAR END CLASS AWARDS

1. Owner and exhibitor must be a member of TPEA.
 - A. If horse is sold Open points will transfer only if the new owner is a member of TPEA
 - B. In case of joint membership, all owners must be TPEA members

C. Ownership determined by PHBA

2. Horse must qualify both days at 2 of the 4 weekends (Stock show points will count, but the show will not count as one of the 2 weekends)

3. WORK SEGMENTS: Each year a volunteer must work "a job" in 2 separate segments per horse by completing the following to be eligible for Year-End awards:

- A. Filling in the appropriate information per horse in the official "Work Segment Book";
- B. Information **MUST** be verified and approved by show staff;
- C. Failure to complete A and B above will result in no work segment being credited to the horse.

(If 2 work segments are not completed the next eligible horse will receive the award)

WORK SEGMENTS (include but are not limited to the following):

1. Halter
2. English
3. Western – Horsemanship
4. Trail

JOBS PER SEGMENT (include but are not limited to the following):

1. Card runner
2. Front gate
3. Back gate
4. Ring steward

4. Owner/Exhibitor must not have any outstanding balance owed to TPEA.

5. All awards require a minimum of 10 points to be earned in the class to be eligible.

6. Youth and Amateur awards based on 1 horse/1 rider. Open & All Breed awards based on horse.

YEAR END HIGH POINT & RESERVE AWARDS (Show management reserves the right to combine awards)

Must meet the eligibility for YEAR-END CLASS AWARD requirements plus any of the following:

Overall High Point Halter Horse: 1 award per sex division presented to the Stallion, Mare and Gelding with the most overall halter points.

Overall Open All-Around High Point & Reserve: Presented to the highest point earning horses earning at least 10 points in halter &/or color and 10 performance points (excluding parade & speed) in at least 2 classes under saddle.

All Around Division High Point: SPECIAL AWARDS (SADDLES, HALTERS, BUCKLES, ETC)

- A. Must meet the eligibility for YEAR-END CLASS AWARD requirements.
- B. Must have earned at a minimum of 10 points in halter, color &/or showmanship and a minimum of 10 points in 2 performance classes (excluding parade & speed)
- C. Must qualify at 3 of the 4 weekends to be eligible. (Stock show points will count, but the show will not count as one of the 3 weekends)

- D. Divisions may be combined in Youth, Amateur, Open & All-Breed if special awards are not sponsored for all divisions

TPEA Open Division (Senior Horse and Junior Horse):

TPEA Amateur & Youth Division (Amateur, Amateur Select, Amateur Walk-Trot, Youth 5-9 Walk-Trot, Youth 10-18 Walk-Trot, Youth 13 & Under, & Youth 14-18):

All Breed (18 & Under and 19 & Over):

Challenge Rider Division (Advanced and Walk/Trot): must show at 2 shows.
